RIGHTS TO USE OF KEELE WORLD AFFAIRS LECTURES

At Keele World Affairs, we wish to share the ideas of our brilliant speakers beyond the audience of members who attend and discuss the issues they raise. Therefore we encourage anyone worldwide to find contextually relevant ways to sharing these ideas.

Are Keele World Affairs Lectures copyrighted?

Yes, they are. Creative Commons licensing doesn't replace copyright -- which remains undivided with Keele World Affairs.

What does the Keele World Affairs Creative Commons license allow?

We make Keele World Affairs Lectures available under the Creative Commons license "Attribution - NonCommercial - NonDerivative" in order to allow non-commercial entities (like bloggers, educators and groups of friends) to use them freely and easily. Important restrictions apply, though, particularly for corporations.

Keele World Affairs' Creative Commons BY-NC-ND license allows you to display Keele World Affairs Lectures under the following conditions:

Attribution (BY): You must explicitly reference Keele World Affairs as the original source of the materials, and Keele World Affairs' logos within the videos and visuals as well as those of the Keele World Affairs Lectures sponsors remain untouched and unedited.

NonCommercial (NC): You can't use Keele World Affairs Lectures (or any parts of them) for commercial purposes.

NonDerivative (ND): You cannot alter the videos in any way. This means you cannot edit, remix, cut, shorten, add overlays to them, or, well, alter them in any way.

Running lectures in their entirety: You may not edit a Keele World Affairs Lecture, or alter it in any way. This is essential for preserving the integrity of the speaker's ideas.

These conditions can be modified only by explicit permission of Keele World Affairs. The complete text of the license can be seen on the Creative Commons (CC) license.

Can I project Keele World Affairs Lectures to a group of people, at a conference, or in my classroom?

Yes, as long as it is a not-for-profit event; in fact, we encourage you to find creative ways to share Keele World Affairs Lectures with your friends, family, students, colleagues, and communities.

However you need to comply with the terms of the Creative Commons license outlined above. In particular, a lecture must be shown unedited, with both the title and end credits.

For projecting Keele World Affairs Lectures, we recommend downloading the video rather than projecting the streaming file from the web.

Can I re-edit and remix Keele World Affairs Lectures?

No. Our Creative Commons BY-NC-ND license clearly states that "derivative works" of any kind (edits, cuts, re-mixes, mashups, etc.) are not allowed without explicit permission from Keele World Affairs and the speaker.

Are there any arrangements whereby I can use the Keele World Affairs Lectures commercially?
